

# Audition with video recording

## **Programme**

- 1. Compositions from different periods and styles (free choice)
- 2. Duration of about 30 minutes

### **Conditions**

- 3. Individual movements of larger pieces (Sonatas, Concertos) are also admitted for the audition. All pieces must be recorded in a single take: cuts or editing within a piece or a single movement (in the case of works articulated in more than one movement) are therefore not allowed.
- 4. The video camera should be place in a way that both the musician and the instrument are always visible. In particular, the face and the hands of the performer should always be visible.
- 5. Only video recordings are allowed. Audio only recordings will not be admitted.

## Format of the video recording

- 6. The recording should be uploaded to a video-sharing platform (e.g. YouTube or Vimeo), and the link shared with the Academic Services through email.
- 7. As an alternative, files may be sent via email in one of the supported formats:
  - a. .avi
  - b. .mov
  - c. .mp4
- 8. It is strongly recommended that videos are recorded in HD quality (or superior quality). Particular attention to audio quality should also be taken care of.

#### **Deadline**

- 9. 15 April 2020, 6:00 p.m. CET
- 10. The link to the recording, or the file itself, should be sent to servizi.accademici@conservatorio.ch

- 13. **File sharing**: should you prefer not to upload your recording to an online platform, we suggest you use one of the following services for sharing the recording file with us:
  - a. WeTransfer
  - b. DropBox
  - c. Google Drive
  - d. OneDrive
  - e. iCloud

Whatever your choice, just make sure that the Conservatorio will be granted access to the recording at least until 30 April 2020.
